How to get to The Watermark

Access from Plymouth

By Public Transport:

- Bus service First X80 or Stagecoach X38 from Bretonside to Ivybridge Town Hall. (20/30 minutes)

By car:

- A38 to Ivybridge, follow signs for town centre car parks. Park in long stay town hall car park (pay & display). Walk past Peacocks (LHS) through short stay car park towards Watermark.

Access from Exeter

By Public Transport

- Stagecoach X38 from Exeter Bus Station to Ivybridge Town Hall (60mins)
- Train to Ivybridge Rail Station, walk down main station access road, turn right at end towards Ivybridge, walk down to roundabout at Bridge Inn, cross road to Watermark at traffic Island (walk approx 30 + minutes)

By Car

- A 38 to Ivybridge, take Wrangaton Cross slip road, turn right at top, across A38 bridge, turn left at T junction, drive towards Ivybridge, turn left at Bridge Inn roundabout to second roundabout (Police Station) to access long stay car park.
- A second Ivybridge slip road is available, follow Ivybridge signs.
